CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

Another year has gone by and I am happy to present my 13th Chairman's Report. Overall it has been a good but challenging year for the board. We have managed to be financially viable and are still getting a lot of success in the competitive areas of squash. This doesn't happen without a great deal of work by the board, our employees and volunteers. Full credit to our players as well.

ASHLEY BROWNRIGG



In the competitive arena the Bay of Plenty Junior Boys Team were winners of the Inter District Competition for the third time which is outstanding. The Bay of Plenty Junior Girls came a very creditable 3rd place which meant Bay of Plenty Juniors were the Overall Second District Junior Team in New Zealand. That is an outstanding achievement which reflects on our superior coaching structure.

Both the Bay of Plenty Senior and Masters Teams have competed very well. We have a New Zealand Champion even though both those teams are in the rebuilding phase. More details in the Coach and Masters reports. At the secondary school level Tauranga Boys College were Runner Up in the New Zealand Secondary Teams Competition.

Of the Bay of Plenty Club Teams that went to the New Zealand Super Champs Finals we had no winners this year but had three runners up and a number of third places. This is still a very good result.

Once again our coaching and administrative structure are highly regarded by both Squash New Zealand and all the other districts. We will continue to work hard in this area and hopefully keep improving our delivery to clubs and upcoming players.

On the financial level Squash Bay of Plenty made a modest profit of \$1,758. We were able to receive \$44,279 in Gaming Charity Grants plus a modest increase in Sponsorship which helped balance the books. A continuing word of warning though we would struggle to operate at the levels we do without these grants so we have to be continually on our guard. We are hopeful of receiving around \$54,000 in Grants next year and so we are able to keep the Court Levies at the same amount in 2016 as charged in 2015. It is a concern that some clubs have been tardy in paying their dues and we will be stricter in following up overdue amounts in 2016 amounts in the 2015 year.

We were able to welcome to the board two new members during the year. These two gentlemen Chris Perkinson and Gavin Hudson have fitted in well and are already contributing new ideas to the board. Also it means the board has got good geographical representation which ensures all clubs have access to a board member who is relatively close by.

As you are no doubt aware Marcus Niles was employed by a separate entity called Waikato BOP Regional Squash Limited and worked half time for the BOP and half time for Waikato. It was decided that with extra time demands from both districts that there needed to be changes. We were fortunate to receive a substantial 3 year grant from Kiwi Squash via Sport Bay of Plenty and were able to offer Marcus a full time position with BOP. He has commenced in this role and will be actively working on promoting squash at all levels solely for the Bay of Plenty. This year we have suffered somewhat from lack of resources and we believe this will help provide extra back up for our Coaching Director. We also expect to provide an even greater service to our stakeholders in 2016. As part of planning for this we are in the process of finalising a new Strategic Plan for the next few years.

I also would like to say a sincere thanks to both Robbie Wyatt and Marcus Niles who have worked tirelessly for the Board. Both men are highly regarded in New Zealand Squash circles and we are very lucky to have them working for Squash Bay of Plenty. I would also like to thank sincerely our other Board Members Vicki Beker, Chris Perkinson & Gavin Hudson for their valuable contributions during the year. Finally I would like to wish all squash people in the Bay a very Merry Christmas and look forward to a prosperous year in 2016.



Another year has come to an end. My 3rd year as regional manager has been a good one. Bay of Plenty Squash is in a good place and I feel we are making progress on and off the court.

The clubs this year have been ticking along reasonably well. The numbers show a steady increase in some clubs, while others have dipped a bit. This is typical of our volunteerbased model as we see passionate people come and go from our committees. Clubs go through ups and downs as



a result, and one of my focusses next year will be on how we better support clubs to avoid the troughs that can occur as good people take a step back. Overall we are up on numbers across the region so there is certainly something to build on. Another area I think we can improve at a regional level is with our communication. As part of our review we plan to look at developing a communication plan to attempt to engage players directly.

Our regional programs are going well, with some that will need attention in the new year. Interclub is steady, and seems to be catering well to that market. This year we introduced a men's and women's premier league. We divided players into even teams and all ties were played at one venue. It was very well received and engaged quite a few higher graded players who wouldn't have normally played interclub.

Superchamps was down on teams entered this year. This is a concern as I believe this event is the single best on the calendar. There will be many reasons for the decline, and I will certainly be looking at ways to address this moving forward.

The Prince Junior 1 day Series was again a roaring success, with 140+ J graders introduced to the sport, and most events filling up. I am confident this series is introducing many kids and parents to our sport in a positive way. Next year we have changed it to include all juniors up to 900 points. This will allow more access for girls who are out of J grade once they hit 601 points.

Champion of Champions was changed this year so that players were invited to enter themselves rather than being nominated by their clubs. Unfortunately the message didn't get down to many of the players, so numbers were disappointing. Next year we have changed the name to 'BOP Regional Graded Champs' to hopefully alleviate the confusion a bit.

Also great to see we are having some success in the refereeing department. 5 new qualified District referees have emerged with a couple talking about taking the next step to National status.

At the Board level we have some new, clever people involved who are leading us in a new direction in terms of governance. One of the big decisions this year was the call made to create a fulltime manager's role in partnership with Kiwi Squash. This is exciting in that it will provide more resource to support our clubs and players. With a strong leadership structure, and the new plans that are currently being worked on, I think we can look to achieving some great things in the next 3 years. While it's a bit sad for me to be leaving behind our Waikato friends, hopefully the positive relationships we have developed will mean we continue to work together to grow our wonderful game. I am looking forward to the next stage and think we are well-placed to continue to build on our successes and keep BOP as one of the leading districts in New Zealand

Coaching the BOP boys under 19 team to their 3rd consecutive New Zealand Inter-District title has to be the most memorable of 2015. Other notable highlights include:

- Jamie Oakley winning the New Zealand under 19 title A brilliant effort.
- Glenn Templeton winning the New Zealand under 15 title his first year in this age group.
- Seven BOP juniors being selected in New Zealand Squads.
- Five BOP juniors just selected for NZ to play in the Trans-Tasman test series against Australia in January 2016.
- Nadia Hubbard being selected to represent NZ at the world junior champs in Holland.
- Ben Grindrod being selected in the NZ Mens Squad.
- Amanda Landers-Murphy being selected in the NZ Womens team to the world champs.

There were many more but I think you will all agree HP wise BOP is blazing away.

For myself being a finalist at the Sport Bay of Plenty awards up against two rugby coaches and a swimming coach is quite a thrill. Attending the Youth Commonwealth Games in Samoa as head coach was another.

To Dave Clarke, Becky Clarke, Graeme Randolph, Wayne Johnston, Mike Walls, Jared Gravatt, Mike Dunston, Lauren Clarke - a huge thanks to those coaches who have coached in the squads this year. We have already had a day camp for all of the squads which was very exciting for myself and the others involved. A stand out for the coaches involved was the future stars which are the young ones. Some great little fellas from Taupo, Geyser, Lakes High and Edgecumbe. 2016 squads for BOP are looking fantastic - Very exciting for the future.

Sport BOP /Coachforce has been solid this year with school programmes going well. Western BOP is very strong in this area. Would like to get more schools involved in Kiwi Squash in 2016, and we are already targeting some, and the response has been positive.

The focus for 2016 that I would like to put in place is targeting more Coaching of Coaches of all levels, and I have already visited many clubs in the past few weeks to discuss this. The response has been fantastic with all clubs I have seen so far keen to be involved. How it works is that I will lock dates in each club for me to visit regularly and upskill the club coaches and volunteer coaches throughout the whole year. The main focus will be on error detection, correction, and progressions. I am also looking forward to working with school groups as part of the Kiwi Squash programme.

In closing I would like to reiterate how much I am looking forward to 2016. I am very aware that for our districts continued progression sitting on hands and being complacent is not an option. It is exciting to have more resources at our disposal, and with the increased investment from Kiwi Sport I think we can achieve some great things next year. I am focused on increasing my visibility and working hard to support the clubs and schools around the BOP. A coach of mine when I was young said that you never stop learning in life and always learn off each other. How true is that.



JUNIOR NATIONALS

Hosted by Squash City Invercargill 1-8 October

The NZ Junior Age Groups and Inter-District teams event are the pinnacle events for junior squash in NZ. The tournament that was held at Invercargill's Squashcity club from 1-7 October was the focus of many Bay player's attention as they worked hard to build up and hone their skills.

In the Age Group event, we were represented by several talented juniors. Two player emerged from the pack and took out their respective age group titles.

Jamie Oakley has had a stellar year, and that continued as he grabbed his first Under 19 NZ title to be crown the best junior in the land. Seeded third, Jaime had to overcome a talented Scott Galloway in the semis, before squaring up against A1 Luke Jones in the final. Jamie played the squash of his life to beat both players 3-0 and finished the tournament without dropping a set. Amazingly both Jamie & Glenn will have another crack in the same age group next year.

Teams Event:

Boys under 13

The teams event that followed is a hard fought battle between the regions to find the best region in the country. 4 junior players from each region (plus a reserve) are selected, and regional bragging rights are up for grabs. The BOP Boys team was chasing it's third title in a row and were confident as top seeds, but they knew they would have to play very well as there were some very strong teams. After topping their pool with comfortable 4-0 wins over Eastern, Central & Canterbury, the lads faced a solid Auckland line-up in the final. The boys raced out to an unassailable 3-0 lead to claim the title and complete a 'three-peat'!!

The girls team were seeded 4th, which meant they faced a superstar Auckland team in the pool. That was their only loss in pool play, which meant they qualified for the 3rd/4th playoff against second seeded Canterbury. Four hard fought matches saw the two teams tied on 2 matches each, but after the countback, BOP secured a podium finish and the bronze medal.



1. Statement of Accounting Policies:

The reporting entity is an Incorporated Society registered under relevant legislation.

The accounting principles recognised as appropriate for the measurement and reporting of earnings and financial position on an historical cost basis have been used, with the exception of certain items for which specific accounting policies have been identified.

2. Changes in Accounting Policies:

The society has no Income Tax liabilities whatsoever as it does not pay Income Tax

7. Contingent Liabilities

The society has no known Contingent Liabilities or financial commitments except the Loan from Squash New Zealand which has to be repaid within the next year.
