




Squash BOP is going along very nicely again after a good year for the region. I was lucky enough to be appointed WSF Technical Director for the World Juniors in Chennai, India. So that took up a couple of weeks in the middle of the season. I had to carefully plan around it, but I believe it was a valuable experience that will benefit myself and the district.

Interclub was steady again this year with team numbers slightly up on 2017. The Premier League went OK this year, but does require a fair bit of looking after to make it successful.

Superchamps this year consolidated on the huge increase in participation

last year. 50 teams again entered our district event, but we did have 5 pull outs after the cut-off. Three national champions emerged, which shows we continue to be a leading district in that event



The HEAD Junior 900 series again was a big success. The only challenge we face now is keeping the series relevant and catering for the demand. A good problem to have. The increase this year in girls participation was particularly pleasing. Each year, the percentage of girls in the series has risen. In 2015 32% of the players were girls, in 2016 it was 33%, last year it was 36%, and this year we had 41% girls. This has led to more meaningful competition for the girls and allowed us to move away from mixed draws.

At the governance level we have enjoyed some continuity on the Board as well as some new faces with a fresh perspective. It is always a challenge to get good people to give up their time to contribute at this level, so we are very fortunate with the board we have. We must continue to work hard to make our sport relevant, and a strong board is critical to that. Financially we are in a great position, but our reliance on external funding remains a concern.

Our squad structure has been solid again this year, but we can't rest on our laurels. Robbie continues to lead our HP programme well, and he has some exciting plans for the future which we hope will keep us as a leading district on the court. All our rep teams have performed admirably this year with a top 4 finish for all teams at their respective national champs.

As always, we are open to new ideas and fresh thinking to grow our game. As a sport we need to keep thinking of ways to get people into Squash, and I believe everyone can play their part in that. In a crowded market maybe we need to be brave and have a crack at something new.

Massive thanks to the Board and all the supporter behind the scenes. BOP is in good heart and continues to truck along nicely as a district. Lastly, thanks to Robbie who is great to work with and does an awesome job as our CoachForce Officer.

I would like to say it has been a privilege to be the Coaching Director for Squash Bay of Plenty again in 2018. Once again amongst the top couple of districts in New Zealand in the performance area. 2019. Certainly, I believe we are the top district with our coaching structure hands down.

Once again, the year started off with club visits in February with Marcus & myself. An excellent opportunity for us to gauge where each club is at pre-squash season. For myself to find out who might be continuing in the coach convener's role for the club or who is new coming into the role. As well as what resources they might need, coaching modules, coaching assistance etc etc. I feel this is a real positive and would like to see it continue. During the year I made more club visits.

SCHOOLS & KIWI SQUASH - A good year on the back of 2017 World Juniors Legacy. I targeted a number of schools around the Bay of Plenty whom now I feel are starting to have Squash as a sport for their schools at the front of their minds. The biggest challenge is getting volunteer coaches/teachers on board in the areas. I have been pleased this year with quite a few teachers stepping up to the mark & wanting to learn the fundamental skills so they can run the classes. Schools I have always felt are so important to our growth as a sport. I have secured a decent number that want to start programs in term one of 2019 rather than term three or four which has been the case in the past. I am currently working on a couple more schools to do the same in Taupo, Reporoa and Omokoroa.

SQUASH NZ MODULES - 12 modules for the year was the target which will have been completed by the end of the year. Managing the Mind facilitated by Dave Clarke have been fantastic & well attended. At Te Puke in June Dave had 24 people take the course. Managing the Mind modules also in Katikati with 13 attending and 12 at Geyser City. I highly recommend these courses for coaches, parents, players. Graeme Randolph held a Big Nix (Mod 3A) in Te Puke in April with myself facilitating Club Youth and Small Nix in Katikati in March and a Club Teams (Mod 9) in April. Taupo completed a Big Nix (Mod 3) in April. Putaruru completed a Club Youth (Mod 4) with Devoy Squash to do 2 modules over the next few weeks, Club Youth and Adult Starters. We are very lucky to have Dave Clarke facilitate the Managing the Mind & Graeme Randolph run modules as well. I will be recommending that clubs run more modules in 2019.

COACHFORCE/ SPORT BOP - It has been a busy year with CoachForce attending regular meetings with the other codes which I find very valuable sharing ideas from other sports. Coaching Passport is up and running which is a system that is supposed to make reporting to the Coach-force officer easier. There have been quite a few challenges but now most of us are getting our heads around it. Having a coaching database of all coaches around the BOP is very useful. Sport BOP is a fantastic organization to work with & seen by the rest of the country as the leader. There will be more and more opportunities for our coaches/parents to attend seminars held by Sport BOP in the future & I will be keeping our coaches and parents up to date with what is happening in 2019.

BOP HP COACHES /MANAGERS - Our district is very lucky to have an excellent stock of HP coaches. Special thanks to BOP Elite Men's/ Junior Boys head coach Dave Clarke & Assistant Mike Hebditch. BOP Future Stars Boys head coach Graeme Randolph & assistant Mike Dunston. BOP Boys Development Squad assistants Graeme Randolph & Mike Dunston. BOP Women's/Elite Girls Head Coaches Danny McQueen & Cheryl Te Kani-McQueen. BOP Girls Development Girls Squad head coach Lauren Clarke & assistants Ash Dunston, Becky Clarke & Tweedy Seymour. BOP Future Stars Girls Squad head coach Ash Dunston & assistants Tweedy Seymour & Lauren Clarke. Also assisting in some squads Amanda Landers-Murphy & Ben Grindrod. There was a national coaching conference held this year in Auckland. Bay of Plenty I was pleased to report had the highest attendance out of all the districts with 11 coaches attending. Thanks to Quadrangular team coaches Graeme Randolph, Mike Dunston, Paul Bedford, & to the management team of Jo Dudson & Lyndon Templeton. Thanks to Danny McQueen, Cheryl Te Kani-McQueen & Kylie Lindsay for coaching & managing the Senior men's & women's team. Thanks to coach Paul Bedford for working with me at the NZ Junior National individuals & teams events. Thanks to managers Hineihaea Murphy & Jo Dudson for their amazing job with the junior boys & girls team.

BOP SQUADS- Another big year of squads in 2018. I feel it is a very important part of our structure. What I have noticed this year is that we have had quite a few young girls coming through again & making some big improvements through-out the region. Our young juniors overall are looking great but I would like to see more BOP players at our BOP Junior Open & also at tournaments like the North Island Juniors & NZ Junior Open.

MY 2018 HIGHLIGHTS -Was another fantastic year. Amanda Landers-Murphy winning gold at the Commonwealth Games womens doubles was amazing. Our Bay of Plenty Senior Women winning the NZ Inter-district teams title two years in a row & our Senior Men finishing second in the NZ Inter-district teams. BOPs Junior Under 19 Boys team finishing second at NZ Inter-district teams & our very young Girls Under 19 team finishing in a creditable fourth. In the latest NZ Junior rankings it has been very pleasing to see that 20 of our Bay of Plenty children are nationally ranked in the top 16.

FINALLY - Have really enjoyed my work with Squash Bay of Plenty this year & a special thanks to Marcus as always being an excellent guy to work with & bounce ideas off. Looking forward to an exciting 2019 with some excellent new plans to be rolled out.



JUNIOR REPRESENTATIVE EVENTS

JUNIOR NATIONALS

For several of our top Bay of Plenty junior players, the 2018 national junior age-groups and teams tournaments have been key events on their squash calendars for some time. Hosted by North Shore Squash Club from 4-10 October, these tournaments provided an opportunity for players to improve their NZ rankings, and test themselves against others in their age group and also against the best juniors from each region.

Individual Event:

The Age Groups tournament ran over four days and involved more than 200 juniors across 5 age group divisions (under 11, under 13, under 15, under 17 and under 19). The Bay of Plenty had representatives in all, except the under 11 girls', divisions.

In addition to the players in the BOP representative boys and girls teams, it was great to see a number of other Bay of Plenty juniors playing — Adam Hitchiner (Devoy), Benjamin Adams (Devoy), Luke Steyn (Taupō), Kyle Steyn (Taupō), Hope Kennerley (Devoy), Joel Kennerley (Devoy), and Zezima Waitai (Edgecumbe) — all of whom either maintained or did better than their seedings, which is certainly no mean feat at that event!

While we didn't take away any titles this year, there were some really close and exciting games, and we had a number of semi-finalists —Taylor Bettleheim (Devoy), Glenn Templeton (Katikati), Luke, and Zezima all made the semi-finals of their divisions, with Luke making an awesome leap from 7th seed to 4th placing in the U15 boys.

Teams Event:

On the Sunday evening, the teams event began. This is always a real battle with a lot of pride on the line! Nine regions put up their best boys and girls teams — Northland, Auckland, Waikato, Bay of Plenty, Central, Eastern, Wellington, Canterbury and Midlands. With 3-4 rounds of pool play, following directly on from the Individuals event, it makes for a lot of tired and sore bodies by the finals day (Wednesday).

This year, both of our teams were young, with a number of new players. Joe Smythe and Taylor Bettleheim joined the team for the first time, alongside previous BOP Boys Team members Glenn Templeton, Manaia Murphy-Fell and Jack Niles. For the BOP Girls Team, Manaia Peeti, Ashley Taylor, Katie Templeton and Amber Knight got to take part in their first Junior teams event with Tenika Dudson and Renee Dudson.

The girls team was seeded 5th and during pool play, won against Canterbury, Wellington, and Central to gain the opportunity to play off for 3rd or 4th place against Auckland. What a huge achievement with some really tough matches along the way. Having Manaia and Katie playing at 3 and 4 made for a strong opposition. At number 1, Tenika was always going to have some really hard match ups but stepped up to the mark and played some of her best squash. Against Wellington the girls learnt the importance of every single point in teams events, with a win by just 3-4 points across all four matches. Unfortunately, in the playoff for 3rd/4th, Auckland were too tough, and the girls team finished 4th. This is huge improvement from finishing in 7th place last year.

The BOP boys team was seeded 2nd, and won their pool play against Northland, Eastern and Wellington. It certainly wasn't an easy run to the finals. The match ups with Wellington were really tough, but Glenn Templeton had a satisfying win over Kobe Fleming who he had lost to in the Individuals event just a couple of days earlier, and Manaia Murphy-Fell stepped up to the mark every day, not losing any of his pool play matches.

As no. 1 seeds, and with three of the country's best junior players, Auckland was always going to be tough. Thanks to Joe Smythe's win, the final result was 3-1 to Auckland and a 2nd overall placing for the boys. With these results, and all but one player (Ashley Taylor) still eligible next year, BOP Squash is in a great position to challenge for titles in 2019.

A special thank you to all of the players—you were all fantastic representatives of Bay of Plenty Squash and were great team members, looking out for and supporting each other. Many thanks also to the coaches, Robbie Wyatt (boys coach) and Paul Bedford (girls coach) who did a great job working with the teams and supporting each player through their games. Our juniors are very fortunate to have your guidance available to them. Finally, thanks to the parents who joined us in Auckland and/or who provided meals and baking to keep 11 hungry teenagers happy!

The Anchor Aims Games was promoted via Squash New Zealand, Squash BOP and also clubs throughout New Zealand were sent a poster and email advising of the tournament. This year the whole tournament was held at the Mt Squash Club with no glass court. In terms of logistics, it was much easier to manage with the one venue. Extra court access was required to accommodate the matches in the one venue. The grandstand seating on the main court was heavily utilised by players, coaches and schools watching play.

The 2018 tournament saw a swiss draw of 26 girls and 56 boys. This were 4 games for the girls and 5-6 games for the boys with some byes. In the lead up to the tournament the draw was redone multiple times (11) to accommodate for injuries and pullouts. 38 schools were represented. Tauranga Intermediate had the biggest contingent of players with 10; followed by Parua Bay School with 6 players. The draws were finalised and uploaded to the NZ Aims Games website prior to the commencement of the tournament.

There was a large range between the top and bottom seeds. Top boy's seed Freddie Jameson was B2 and top girl's seed Sophie Hodges A2 —the only female A-grade player in the history of the event. The tournament comprised 6 New Zealand Junior Development Squad members. The tournament also comprised Oceania Champs, age group title holders, club champs, regional champs, North Island champs, Canadian champ.

73% of the boys entries were J-grade players whilst 50% of the girls were J-grade. Due to there being a number of J-graded players, we had to officiate more games or request higher graded players to assist with reffing games. All were happy to assist as required. Play ran ahead of schedule for most of the tournament.

Matches were livestreamed all day on Monday and for the finals on Thursday which was very much appreciated by the players and their families back home. Commentary was provided between games for the finals by New Zealand High Performance Coach Robbie Wyatt.

A huge thanks to Marcus Niles, Ross McCurran and Robbie Wyatt for their assistance during the tournament. Two tournament controllers were generally on duty at all times.

10. Wages

Squash BOP has two full time employees. A Squash BOP Manager and a Coach Force Manager. Funding for the coach force manager is 89% from external funding (mainly coach force) and is monitored by Coach Force to ensure that the outcomes are delivered. The BOP Manager is employed 40 hours to administer and deliver programmes, co-ordinate our regional teams, and deliver competitions to the stakeholders.

It is recognised that during the year by the board, that Squash BOP underwrites time that the BOP manager spends on non squash BOP tasks, which are not included in the managers job description, but are in the best interest of squash. This includes but was not restricted to the World Junior Squash event in India

11. World Junior Girls Squash 2017 Advance

The Bay of Plenty Major Event fund has asked Squash BOP to hold in a bank account \$29500 on it's behalf, which is tagged funds for future major events only. Spending of these funds are at the discretion of the Bay of Plenty Major Events and not Squash BOP. At balance date \$4,500 still needs to be transferred from the Squash BOP bank account to the ANZ - World Squash Savings Account.
