2020 will go down as a very tough year, but I feel like Squash in the Bay has come through the COVID pandemic as well as could have been expected. The season was disrupted with clubs having to close their doors for 7 weeks due to the lockdown. After lockdown was lifted, the country was also operating under various alert levels for several weeks,, which restricted the amount and type of sport that could be played. The Government financial support of clubs and Squash BOP meant the clubs and district weren't severely impacted. It did mean planning was extremely difficult



and there was a lot of uncertainty around events and competitions. We had to quickly amend our calendar and make sure our events were complying with the appropriate health and safety requirements. Luckily, our clubs are very resilient and were able to quickly adapt to protect their members and put good protocols in place. We remain in uncertain times, but we are lucky to be in NZ where the virus is currently contained, and we can operate as normally as possible.

The events lost to COVID this year included Senior Teams, BOP Open, Junior Quadrangular, NZ Junior Open, Cousins Shield and Mitchell Cup, as well as several club tournaments. It also forced amendments to superchamps, interclub, the HEAD Junior 900 series, as well as the Womens 900 series. It also meant the cancellation of the World Juniors in the Gold Coast, which meant selected players Glenn Templeton & Joe Smythe missed out on representing NZ. After the calendar was adjusted and events started to proceed, we saw a strong engagement from players. Tournaments have been wellsubscribed, and clubs are reporting increases in membership & activity.

Our programs were also badly disrupted due to lockdown, and it had an impact on how much we could achieve in areas such as coach development, squads, and referee development. Not only were many programs cancelled, uncertainty around the virus made it very difficult to plan anything.

The HEAD 900 series was again a very successful series, with 91 kids playing in at least one event. The Women's Beginner series across BOP & Waikato has gathered momentum and the events are showing pretty strong growth, and the players love it. We trialed a similar men's series this year, but it has seen a slow uptake so far.

Despite a very short lead in for Superchamps due to lockdown, we saw very strong numbers again this year. Including invited teams, the Bay had 13 teams away at the national finals, and one team came home with the trophy.

The Board has continued to be very capable leaders for our sport and we are lucky to have such a high calibre group. Gavin Hudson was forced to step aside during the year due to work commitments, and he will be sorely missed. Vicki Beker is stepping down this year after 5 years as chair. Vicki & Gavin have been fantastic for Squash BOP and I would like to sincerely thank both of them for the amazing work they have done over the years. They have certainly left Squash BOP in a better place than when they arrived.

Robbie has done a great job under challenging circumstances this year. With the help of Kiwisport funding, the Eastern BOP Junior Program was very successful, and he is focussed on ensuring that continues next year with his support. The Coaching Conference was a big success and saw really good engagement from coaches as well as some very strong presenters. We have built up a group of coaches that are the envy of many other districts. Its great working with Robbie, and we are very lucky to have such a well-respected and capable coach working with our players and clubs. I am always keen to hear ideas on how we can further maximise his impact in the district.





COACHING DIRECTOR'S REPORT ROBBIE WYATT

Well the year 2020 has been a very unbelievable year for us all with COVID-19 hitting the world. This made our sport of squash nationwide very challenging in so many ways. After lockdown and we were allowed back on the courts it was a great feeling that is for sure. This certainly made for a very condensed calendar for the rest of 2020. I want to thank the board of Squash



Bay of Plenty for being so supportive during the very tough and uncertain times of lockdown. Regular zoom calls were excellent and thanks to Jim for our weekly catchup calls. That really meant a lot to me.

Club Visits: Marcus and myself visited the majority of clubs before lockdown. Again I feel it is an excellent way to communicate face to face with everyone. After lockdown I continued visiting the last few clubs. I've continued on visiting other coach convenors around the area throughout the second part of this year.

Coachforce: Regular Coachforce meetings are back on track and Trudy Kemp who is our Coachforce coaching advisor has been doing a fantastic job. I have mentioned in past reports but Coachforce give me a valuable opportunity to present and learn and share with many other codes. 2021 is looking very busy with a good number of conference opportunities.

KiwiSport: We were lucky enough to get some Kiwisport funding across the line through Sport BOP to run a term 3 program over in the Eastern BOP area. This meant we were able to pay two coaches (Logan Brewer and Glenn Templeton). It was a very full program for the two guys on each Monday starting at Reporoa College where from 9am to 11am they coached 30 students, then straight over to Galatea school from 12pm to 2pm where they coached around 20 children. Finally, off to Edgecumbe Squash Club for the Eastern BOP Junior Program, which included Edgecumbe, Whakatane, Taneatua, Marist, Opotiki. The term went very well, and now from that Glenn continues to travel to Galatea School and Edgecumbe for term four. Logan also ran a Kiwi Squash program at Katikati College in term 3. It was run at 645am-845am at the Katikati Squash Club and involved 20 kids each week.

Coach Development: Finally, the Foundation Coach section of the framework has been rolled out by Squash NZ. The first practical session in New Zealand was delivered at Geyser City with 15 beginner/intermediate coaches attending from Bay of Plenty and 5 coaches from other districts. I will be delivering a couple of Foundation Practical Sessions next year and also hopefully once it is completed a couple of Development Coach Practical as well.

BOP Squads: This year our squads included; U23 Boys Squad (including senior Men), Womens Elite Squad, Junior Elite & Development Girls Squad, and BOP Rollers. The squads this year had to be also condensed into a shorter time frame. I was very pleased with the commitment to the squads from the players with attendance being excellent overall. These squads are very important to our structure and pathway. The new permanent squad called the BOP Rollers went pretty well but need to make some tweaks for next year. It is a fantastic opportunity for our J & E Graders who are keen on squash to have training camps outside of their junior club programs and also have fun and learn from BOPs best coaches.

BOP Coaches: I keep saying that Squash BOP has the best coaching stocks in New Zealand and that is definitely still the case. Big thanks this year to our amazing squad coaches, Dave Clarke, Becky Clarke, Lauren Clarke, Graeme Randolph, Tweedy Seymour, Logan Brewer, Mike Hebditch, Brendon Morrison, Kashif Shuja, Dame Susan Devoy, Wayne Johnston, Glenn Templeton and Kelly Shilton.

NZ Junior Nationals: We were very lucky that this major junior tournament went ahead unlike the teams event for the senior nationals. Big thanks to Girls coach Becky Clarke and team Manager Kelly Mitchinson who did a fantastic job with a great group of kids. Individually our kids did very well with Edgecumbe's Zezima Waitai winning the NZ U11 title in a hard fought four setter against Dominic Lim from Canterbury. Maiya Hotham from Putaruru finished 4th in the girls U13, Luke Steyn from Taupo finished 3rd in the boys U17, Joe Smythe from Devoy Squash finished 3rd in the boys U19 and Glenn Templeton from Katikati finished 4th in the boys U19. Joe Smythe was also named New Zealand junior boys most improved which was very well deserved after a fantastic season.

In Closing: Once again a massive thanks to my work colleague and friend Marcus. Great guy to work with and many thanks for all his support during this very challenging year. Also, to Vicki and the board members. What an awesome bunch of people. Special mention to my friend and BOSS Vicki who has done a fantastic job as chair over the last 5 years. Finally, let's bring on a positive and exciting 2021

NEW ZEALAND MASTERS

The National Masters was hosted this year by the Whangarei Squash Club during 16-20 October. This club has space to burn and was a great venue. Whangarei is a great place – small enough to move around easily, well laid out and of course a wonderful environment. The BOP team had two virgins this year - Korina and Rachel. New blood was great to have and they gelled really well into the team. The team stayed in one big beautiful house, the Regent Residential Villa, and this created a wonderful team interaction and atmosphere.

Individuals

BOP featured strongly in the Individuals. Eight players contested age group finals and four National age group titles were won: Jo Shanks W35+, Kashif Shuja, M40+, Kathryn McKay W55+, Bernie Dawson M65+. Jo won, playing on legs that were only just returning from serious injury. She was very determined winning against a brave Karen Roberts. For all of us privileged to see Kashif play Neil in the M40+ final, we witnessed the expression of true character, guts and grit that in a very high quality, high drama match in which both players were at the very end of their endurance. Kathryn vanquished all even with her dubious knee. And Bernie jubilantly claimed his maiden title.

Teams

In the Teams, three of our four title holders could not play due to injury related causes. The Teams event was a nine draw with BOP seeded fourth. We dispatched Central first and then fought to a 6 matches-all, 23-22 games victory over Canterbury in a very nervous and exciting rubber where all team members gave everything. The team was happy to pip Canterbury to put us into the top playoff group with Waikato and Auckland. We beat Waikato 7-5. On the day, Auckland were too strong beating BOP 9-3 but a second placing was an excellent result for BOP.

This year the men achieved more victories than the women, reversing the trend of the last few years. Aaron Kopittke won all his matches anchoring the team with high quality squash. Team members experienced both brilliant victories and heart-breaking defeats in tight matches and supported by the team's nurturing culture.

This year's top performances have not been an accident. Kashif has been leading us with workshops to formulate our own goals and share them with him and the team. He asked as well for us to identify an extra 10% which we can call on in tight matches.

Bay of Plenty was represented by our top junior players at the national age group individual and teams tournament. This year the Individual and Teams event was run over 5 days, a day less than last year. This put our Junior players under immense physical pressure with many of our kids playing 9 highly competitive games over the 5 days. A huge ask for some of our younger, less experienced players. Bay of Plenty was well represented at the individual prizegiving.

The team event started soon after the individual prizegiving and was awesome to see our juniors switch to team mode, working together and encouraging each other as every point mattered to secure a win for the team.

The girls were 7th seeds in a draw of 8. They lost to Auckland and Midlands but beat Southland and Northland to come away with placing 6th, an outstanding effort from our girls for such a young, developing team.

The Boys were 2nd seeds in the top division for this event. They came away beating Canterbury, Waikato and Midlands securing their place in the final against top seed Auckland. This was a highly competitive final between the 2 top teams but Bay of Plenty ended up losing 3 games to 1. Still a fantastic effort placing 2nd.

Huge thanks to the awesome leadership of our coaches Robbie Wyatt and Becky Clarke who were at the squash club all day and night, coaching and mentoring our Juniors. We are very lucky to have such amazing supportive coaches in the Bay.

I thoroughly enjoyed managing this group of awesome young people. Their behaviour was exemplary and there was a lot of fun and laughs along the way. Most of all I was so impressed with the kids supporting each other on the court and forming great friendships off the court. A real pleasure to be part of Bay of Plenty Squash.

This year we had a record number of entries with 52 teams entered. There was a range of players which allowed us to make; Open Divisions for Men's, Women's and Mixed, 1 x Men's Division, 2 x Mixed Divisions, 2 x Beginners Divisions (a mixed and a women's)

The decision to play to par 11 or 15 best of 3 or best of 5 and golden point or win by 2 was a real talking point and I struggled with what was the right thing to do. In the end I decided to play the Open Divisions Best of 3 Par 11 win by 2, all the other divisions were Best of 5 Par 11 win by 2. Whilst there was a bit of confusion to start with but soon worked itself out. Feedback on this after the event was that it was the right decision, one of the men's semi finals went for 77 minutes and that was best of 3 so best of 5 would've taken much longer.

Of all of the players registered to play the doubles only 12 players were from clubs outside of the Bay. When I played at the Auckland Doubles earlier in October, I took a poster up and put it on the notice board, some of New Zealand's top players were playing at that tournament and they also entered the BOP Doubles, a facebook event was also created and players invited through social media. BFA Business Advisors and Accountants were our main sponsor along with the sponsorship from Squash BOP made the prize money an attractive and all prizes were Cash, BFA also made a prize for the Best Dressed and Best Club.

Best Dressed made for some very creative costumes, the Women's Beginners Division made a great effort in their costumes but the winners came from the Men's Division 1 with Jason Hannah (Geyser) and Braeden Brewer (Katikati) not only winning the Best Dressed but also winning there division.

Best Club was worked out with the winners and runner up from each division getting points for their club. The players that were from clubs outside of the Bay got to chose a club to support. Clive Waugh was in charge of this and yet again did an amazing job with very little left over. This allowed Marcus to get straight into the awards night after the double prize giving. 9. Wages

Squash BOP has two full time employees. A Squash BOP Manager and a Coach Force Manager. Funding for the coach force manager was 56% from external funding (mainly coach force) and is monitored by Coach Force to ensure that the outcomes are delivered. In this financial year we had a decrease in grants to cover the Coach Force Manager from other external sources due to COVID. The BOP Manager is employed 40 hours to administer programmes, co-ordinate our regional teams, competitions to the stakeholders. During the year Squash BOP wage subsidy of \$23,432 to help meet the wages of the two full time employees.

It is recognised that during the year by the board, that Squash BOP underwrites time that the BOP manager spends on non squash BOP tasks, which are not included in the managers job description, but are in the best interest of squash.

10. Income in Advance

Taupo squash Clubs was Invoiced on account their 2021 Club Management Contribution.

The 2020 Masters team were invoiced for their contribution in the current year. The Masters event did not occur until after balance date therefore their contribution has been recorded as Income in advance.

11. Grants Received in Advance

Squash BOP received a Grant for the Managers wages in September 2020 of \$25,000 which covers wages over the period October, November and December 2020.
